CO D-SNPs Overview

What are CO D-SNPs?

- CO D-SNPs are a specific type of Medicare Advantage plan for individuals enrolled in both Medicare and Medicaid.
- These plans are less integrated, providing a member's Medicare-covered services, but not managing or covering their state Medicaid benefits.
- The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) allows CO D-SNPs to enroll both full dual eligible and partial dual eligible members.
 - **Full duals** are individuals who qualify for both Medicare and the full range of Medicaid benefits.
 - **Partial duals** are individuals who qualify for Medicare and a Medicare Savings Program (MSP), but not full Medicaid benefits. They receive only Medicare premium assistance through ODM.

D-SNP Organizations

Nine organizations currently offer 25 CO D-SNPs under 14 CMS contracts.

Note: Not every Medicare plan offered by these organizations are D-SNPs. They offer general Medicare Part C plans as well.

ODM's Decision on CO D-SNPs

ODM will not be extending State Medicaid Agency Contracts (SMACs) to CO D-SNPs in 2027. This decision:



Maximizes the number of dual eligible members who receive integrated Medicare and Medicaid benefits through the Next Generation MyCare plans.



Prevents Medicare organizations cost-shifting to ODM.



Creates a less complex Medicare landscape for dual eligible members.
